Mrs. William Bristol spent a day recently at the home of her niece, Mrs. Ruth Higgins.

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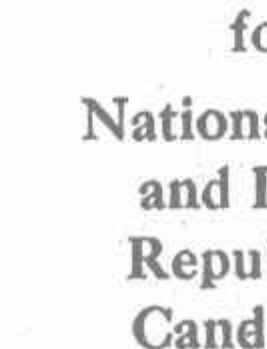
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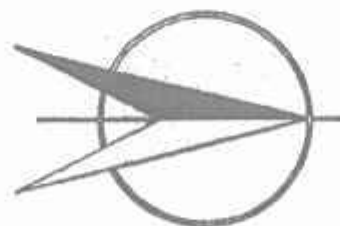
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
