LOCKPORT, N.Y. (AP)—Two automobiles collided on a rural intersection about seven miles northwest of this Niagara County city Sunday killing two persons.

Scattered Protests

Protesters and pranksters interfered with some observances, but in at least one instance, the protesters themselves were hindered by weather.

A Yippie demonstration in New York's Central Park was called off due to the weather.

Sunrise services, being broadcast nationally from Paradise Valley golf course in Albuquerque, N.M., were cut short when anti-Vietnam war demonstrators tried to get control of the microphone.

The Columbia Broadcasting System said it was the first time it had cut short a broadcast because of a demonstration.

In Wichita, Kan., six Negroes interrupted services at the First United Methodist church and were granted 10 minutes to de-

mand \$2 million for the Black United Fund.

A three-alarm fire disrupted services at historic Mission Dolores which was built by Mexican settlers in San Francisco in 1782. Damage was estimated at \$850,000.

In Two Rivers, Wis., pranksters added two extra gold-colored eggs to one the Veterans of Foreign Wars had hidden—with a bicycle as reward for the finder. Two children were mightily disappointed, but only one who found the VFW egg got the bicycle.

Cancels Parade

Atlantic City canceled what would have been its 95th Easter Parade on the boardwalk because of the storm. The parade usually attracts 150,000 persons.

Parades in Northern Ireland commemorating the Easter Rebellion of 1916 against the Brit-

ish erupted into violence in Londonderry and Lucan. Fourteen persons were arrested and 17 troops and policemen injured.

There were fewer Christian pilgrims at the holy places in Jerusalem than in the years before the Arab-Israeli war of 1967, since which time the city has been under exclusive Israeli control. Only about 1,000 persons took part in services at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

At the Vatican, Pope Paul VI pleaded in his annual Easter message for an end to such "local wars" as those in the Middle East and Vietnam.
