WESTVILLE — The ground breaking for the Gateway Regional Junior High School, which was postponed last Saturday due the death of President Kennedy will not be re-scheduled. Ralph Henderson, president of the board of education, said this is because the construction work was started this week.

Instead, the shovel, which was to be used in the ceremony, wil be inscribed with appropriate words on the President's death and will be placed in the school as a memorial, the board president added.

The proposed school, located of the 38-acre site of the forme Rizzuto farm, Deptford Township will cost \$1.6 million. It will hous seventh through ninth grad pupils from Wenonah, Westville National Park and Woodbur

The high school will have a functional capacity of 800 students and could accommodate 1,000 according to John M. Lelko, superintendent of schools.

There will be 23 academic classrooms, and laboraories, administration and office areas, a library, lockers, showers, 609-seat auditorium and a 359student cafeteria. Completion is scheduled for this summer.
