## Coast Guard At Cape May to Get Sewer Link

Pumping Station,  
Main to Connect  
To Sewage Plant

CAPE MAY, May 28 (AP)—Planning is under way for the construction of a sewer pumping station to link the Coast Guard barracks with the city's disposal facility, it was announced Tuesday.

The project also calls for a new main on Delaware ave. between the base and facility. The sewer disposal route would be shared by the Federal Government and local authorities.

**WILLIAMS SEEKS DATA**  
Sen. Frank A. Williams, Jr. (D., N.J.) announced he was seeking information about the health of the Coast Guard concerning reports that their installation, located at the charging sewage and desalination wastes into New Jersey waters.

Williams asked for details and contemplated corrective action. He also requested that the House Government Operations subcommittee that has been studying the matter be kept advised of any pollution on the Cape May Coast Guard training station.
